Page 29 – 1E. - Does this mean any state highway that borders the development?

Page 29 – 1H. – What are the roof drains connected to?

Page 30 – 1I. – Aren't we trying to stop the stormwater runoff from going directly into the stream?

Page 30 – 1O – What are we trying to stop in this section?

Page 36 – B – When is this required and at what time during the development process?

Page 37 – (1) – Does this pertain to the sanitary sewer line?

Page 42 – 7 – Asked what is a retention basin?

Page 45 – 9B. – When is this required?

Linda Hagenbuch, 821 West Siddonsburg Road – stated that allowing bridges in the floodway is in favor of the developer.

It was moved by Supervisor Brown, seconded by Supervisor Faulkner, and unanimously carried to adopt Ordinance Number 2003-148 an Ordinance of Carroll Township, York County, Dillsburg, Pennsylvania, establishing rules, regulations and standards governing stormwater management within Carroll Township, setting forth the procedures to be followed by the officials of the Township in applying and administering these rules, regulations and standards; and providing penalties for the violation thereof as modified.

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INTRODUCTION	Jennifer Hipp, Esquire, gave a brief summary on the Nuisance Ordinances. Chairman Schopfer opened the floor for public comment for the Nuisance Ordinances.
PUBLIC COMMENT	<p>Ordinance Number 2003-149</p> <p>Robert Schrift – 25 Hidden Springs Road – questioned Section 3.B. – the storage of abandoned or junked vehicles on private or public property – how many vehicles are they allowed to have? Mrs. Hipp explained that this section was changed to read vehicle(s).</p> <p>Andrew Hagenbuch – 821 W. Siddonsburg Road – questioned Section 3.F. – what is a fact and what constitutes a fact?</p>


