Dear Deana,

Thank you for writing to Carroll Township with your request for information pursuant to the Pennsylvania Right-To-Know law.

On July 10, 2009 you requested copies of "on or before April 14, 2009: Village at South Mountain – 1. Revised Traffic Impact Study, 2. Revised Stormwater Report, 3. Architectural Design Standards

Your request for the aforementioned records is denied because they are exempt from access as permitted by Section 708(b)(10) of the Right to Know Law. The records requested constitute documents which will be used in internal, predecisional deliberations of the Township Board of Supervisors, staff and Township Solicitor in connection with ongoing settlement discussions concerning a land use appeal filed by the developer with regard to the denial of a subdivision plan for the Village at South Mountain. The requested documents will not be deliberated in a public meeting, but will be part of discussions concerning settlement of the land use appeal between the Township Board of Supervisors, staff and Township Solicitor, which will occur in executive session pursuant to Section 708(a)(4) of the Sunshine Law.

You have a right to appeal this denial of information in writing to Terry Mutchler, Executive Director, Office of Open Records, Commonwealth Keystone Building, 400 North Street, 4th Floor, Harrisburg, PA 17120.

If you choose to file an appeal you must do so within 15 business days of the mailing date of the Township's response in accordance with Section 1101 of the Right-To-Know-Law.
